BIG IDEA

ICEBREAKER/CHECK-IN QUESTION

- Share a funny or embarrassing moment when you set a goal but fell short of achieving it.

DISCUSS

- Share one or two thoughts that stuck out to you from this week's message.
- How do you currently approach setting and pursuing goals in your life? Are there any major goals that you're currently working towards? How about in your spiritual life?
- Are there any goals in your life that you feel may be in conflict with God's plan for you? How can you align your goals with His plan?
- How can being part of a Christian community help us in reframing our goals and pursuing a deeper relationship with Christ?
- Share a personal experience where pursuing a goal centered around knowing Christ resulted in positive changes in your life and relationships.
- How can knowing Christ and aligning our goals with His purposes ultimately bring fulfillment and purpose to our lives?

DISCUSS

- How can Philippians 3:13-14 inspire us to let go of past mistakes or regrets and focus on the future and what God has in store for us?
- How does the concept of citizenship in heaven, mentioned in Philippians 3:20, impact the way we view and pursue our goals in this earthly life?
- Are there any practical steps or habits you can incorporate into your daily routine to help you deepen your relationship with Christ and make Him known?
